Year 4 have enjoyed their first half term of swimming at Kings Leisure Centre.

They have thoroughly enjoyed their sessions at Kings Leisure which provides us with 3 swimming coaches for each lesson, so the children are taught all at the same time, in three small groups to optimise their learning.

## This week in.

Reception Class: In Reception this week we have continued with our story of A Squash and a Squeeze. We have each taken it in turns to hot seat the character of the Little Old Lady from the story. We have had a special visit from Baishali who came to speak to us about the Hindu festival of Diwali. In maths we have been rolling dice, subitising and counting out toppings onto pizzas.

Year 1 Class: This week in year 1 we have started our new science unit 'animals'. We began this unit by learning about all the different animal classifications e.g. mammals, reptiles, birds etc. We learnt that we are mammals because we have hair, give birth to live babies and have a backbone! We have a special visitor coming into school on Monday to teach us about the different animals that live in the Arctic and Antarctic - linking to our topic 'Polar Explorers'.

Year 2 Class: In computing this week we have been using a programmable floor robot (Beebot) to see if we can move in a specific direction and ultimately develop an algorithm to create to create 2D shapes. We also have made poppies for Remembrance Day and observed one minute of silence at 11am this morning.

Year 3 Class: Have been learning about rivers in Geography, this week we have looked at what features we find in the upper, middle and lower course of the river and have drawn some beautiful diagrams to show this. We also began our new science unit this week on Forces and Magnets, we looked closely at push and pull forces and played some push and pull bingo! Finally, in English the children have worked hard this week on their Non-Chronological Reports hot writes, each child chose an animal to write about and have produced some excellent reports!

Year 4 Class: We are now well underway with rehearsals for this year's Christmas play. The children are starting to learn their lines and are beginning to bring their characters to life. Next week, the stage will be going up in the hall, which will be very exciting! In Geography, the children have enjoyed looking at the countries surrounding the Mediterranean -they loved using chrome books to explore these countries on Google maps. In English, the children have continued to explore the features of a warning story and are now able to move onto the innovate stage next week. The children have worked very hard this week and produced some pleasing work.

Rainbow Woods Pre-School: We had a wonderful week celebrating Diwali. We had a lovely time listening to the Diwali story and watching why we celebrate Diwali. We used our fine motor skills to make a rangoli pattern. We made Diwali diyas using clay and then painted and decorated them with lots of colours and glitter. Diyas are used for welcoming goddess Lakshmi and for celebrating the victory of good over evil. Baishali came dressed in a saree which is a traditional Indian dress. She spoke to the children about what food is cooked, how sweets are distributed to everyone and how all the community come together to celebrate the event.
We made poppies to celebrate Remembrance Day using paper plates. The children watched a video on Remembrance Day to understand why it is so important.


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
