This week in...

Reception Class: In Reception this week we have continued with the story of the Billy Goats Gruff and have sequenced the story. We have learnt about all the products you are able to make from goats milk. We have made a home for the troll and even made our own trolls using plastercine and various loose parts. We have made a bridge for the goats to cross using crates and wood. In our art area we have looked at different bridge designs and have then designed our own. In maths we have explored patterns, 3d shapes and sorting a variety of objects in different ways. We have continued with the story of Easter and talked about what our Christian value of forgiveness means.

Year 1 Class: This week in year 1 we have been assessing the children's reading and phonics and I am delighted to share that as a class we have seen massive amounts of progress since last half term, they are doing really well! In literacy we have been doing more work on Mr Gumpy's Outing. We have discussed that Mr Gumpy's name is a proper noun so it needs to start with a capital letter and the children completed a writing task based on this. We have also been discussing the vocabulary from the story and what unfamiliar words mean e.g. squabble, outing, trample.

Year 2 Class: We have written our second (innovate) diary write this week based on a part of the Little Red Riding Hood story. In Geography we have been looking at drought and what it means to people and animals in countries like Kenya. We have created a whole class list of how to save water. We will publish it on Class Dojo for you to see.

Year 3 Class: Have been busy making Stonehenge models this week and we were excited to paint them to see the final products! We have started looking at persuasive writing in English and have learnt our model text "Hawk Ridge Farm Park" which is a fantastic text featuring lots of persuasive language including rhetorical questions and boastful language.

Year 4 Class: Have done some amazing maths this week, including an investigation about odd and even numbers as well as exploring square numbers and some extremely enthusiastic practise of a 7-times table rock song! In English, we are now learning about instruction texts, using our model text, 'How to Keep a Teacher Happy'. Now we are starting to think about what makes pupils happy, for our innovate write next week. In art, the children are currently creating some beautiful rainforest paintings based on the work of Henri Rousseau.

Rainbow Woods Pre-School: This week we have been focusing our learning around the great outdoors. We have made numbers using things that we have found in our forest school and we have been exploring all the different textures they have and the sounds they make if we touch them. We have also been making playdough from scratch with the children measuring out the ingredients themselves and mixing the correct colours to make the very hungry caterpillar. We have also been singing our nursery rhymes using our rainbow tent which the children love!

Each half term we focus on a Christian Value, this term it is Forgiveness

Exciting news! It's back. We are planning to run our Football Academy once again this summer. The Football Academy is centred around children of all abilities and ages having an enjoyable football experience whilst learning new skills. Our goal is that all children have a fantastic time, have fun, and make friends through playing football.

The academy begins on **Monday 29th July** and finishes on **Thursday 1st of August**, starting at **9am** and finishing at **4pm**. The academy is open to children from **Year 1 – Year 11**. It will be held at Hugh Sexey Middle School, Blackford, Wedmore, BS28 4ND. The timetable incorporates a mix of training, tactics, tournaments, competitions, and fitness. We aim to deliver high quality coaching whilst the children enjoy themselves participating in tournaments, games, and challenges.

The academy is staffed by teachers/qualified FA coaches who are First Aid trained and have experience of coaching children. The cost per child will be £100 for the four days or £30 for a day. We hope you agree this offers excellent value for money considering the level of coaching and activities provided. Each child will leave with a Participation Medal and a Football. Throughout the four days there are plenty of chances to win prizes, trophies, and various medals in all types of competitions such as Crossbar Challenge, 5 sec shootout and Penalty Shootout. On the final day there is a presentation ceremony where prizes and medals are given out.

Wells Cathedral

Next week from Tuesday 27 February to Saturday 2 March, the 'Crown and Coronation' light show, an immersive spectacle of the Crown Jewels and Coronations, is coming to Wells Cathedral. This stunning show, created by Historic Royal Palaces and Luxmuralis, and premiered in November on the Tower of London, will bring more than 1000 years of history to life, right here in Somerset and is the first time a light show of this scale will be presented in the Cathedral.
