## This week in...

Reception Class: This week we have started our new talk for writing text called "A Fruit Is a Suitcase for a Seed" and we have looked at a life cycle of plants. We have looked at packets of seeds and have designed our own seed packet which we have displayed in our classroom. In Maths we have been looking at measuring using non-standard units and identifying if an object is heavier, lighter or balanced using balance scales. In RE we have continued with the Easter story and talked about ways in which we have used the Christian value of forgiveness this week.

Year 1 Class: This week Year 1 have fully immersed themselves in their history topic 'Who were the famous people of Bristol', more specifically, Brunel! We have learnt about why the SS Great Britain was a significant invention in it's time and we went to visit it on Friday! The children had a fantastic time! On Thursday, the children also learnt about the Clifton suspension bridge

and had a go of sketching it in their art books as Brunel would have done when he designed it. We also saw it as we drove through Bristol!

Year 2 Class: After completing our diary write about the Florence Nightingale which was very successful, we have now started a new unit of writing with the story: 'Kassim and the Greedy Dragon'. When we have finished our story map we will learn the story which helps us to retell it in our writing books. We have almost completed designing our own symmetrical coats linked to the Joseph and his Amazing Coat story.

Year 3 Class: Have started learning about column addition in maths this week and have done a super job with it, they will now be learning how to complete the regrouping of numbers on column addition. In English, we completed our hot write where the children had to write a persuasive text about why people should visit Carymoor for a Stone Age day (we went here on a school trip two weeks ago which made it much easier to be persuasive), they have published their work onto leaflets which has made a lovely display in the classroom. In history we have learnt about the importance of the invention of the wheel, the discovery of the iron ore and what iron age hill forts were used for.

Year 4 Class: This week, year 4 have been introduced to a new genre of writing 'character sketches' and have enjoyed immersing themselves in our model text, 'Tim'. Linked to our geography topic the children have starting to put together their beautiful rainforest collages inspired by Henri Rousseau. On Wednesday we went on our class trip to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm and enjoyed a fantastic rainforest workshop. The children loved being able to hold a Madagascan hissing cockroach and stroking a tiny, a very cute, Tenrec - which looks very similar to a hedgehog but is actually related to an elephant! A great day had by all - bringing the rainforest to life!

Rainbow Woods Pre-School: This week we have been completing our Easter cards and practicing our Easter Song and signing the words in time for our service next week. We have started to plant our Sunflower seeds ready to watch them grow. We have made Spring activities using different materials which the children have loved using their imagination and expressing themselves through their artwork. Next Monday we will be having a guest in to celebrate 'Holi', the festival of colours! So exciting!

Each half term we focus on a Christian Value, this term it is Forgiveness
