## This week in...

### Rainbow Woods Preschool



This week we are carrying on our topic of The Animal Kingdom, and we are now looking at farm animals. We are looking at their habitats, what they like to eat, and how we look after them. We are replicating their environment through play, using straw, hay etc. We have also been working on our maths language with the children, using phrases of "half/quarter full/empty" etc

We have been using our forest school area and exploring and observing the changes in the plants and bugs. We are carrying on our twice weekly sessions of yoga and relaxation, and we have been encouraging independence in the children for their self-care.

### Reception



In Reception we have continued with The Sheep and the Goat story. We have talked about how we can make friends and never ever break friends. We have carefully drawn observational drawings of zoo animals. In maths we have investigated two numbers that can be added together to make 5. We have been doing some super letter formation this week and have continued with our caption writing.

Year 1



This week year 1 have been busy studying their model instruction text in English by following it to make Marvellous Medieval Crowns of their own. The children followed each step to produce perfect, golden crowns - Mrs Malcolm even bought them some real gemstones to decorate them with! We discussed the concept of 'less is more' and came up with some ideas of how we could organise the gemstones neatly so they looked more artistic and real. In History, the children have studied the very first types of castles that were built in medieval times, these were called motte and bailey castles. They have learnt what each part of a motte and bailey castle was/what it was used for. A massive thank you to Mrs Horton for spending her own time creating a beautiful castle for our display board, the children LOVE it!

### Year 2



We continue to find opportunities to promote reading in different ways. Ladybird children were very excited when their teddies and soft toys visited us this week so they could listen to our fantastic readers during our Guided Reading sessions. They spent the rest of two days in the Book Corner looking at our exciting book collection.

### Year 3



Year 3 have had an exciting visitor this week who brought in an incubator with 14 eggs in. The eggs will stay in the incubator for 21 days before hatching. Next Friday, they will be 'torched' which means we will be able to see whether the eggs are fertile by shining a torch through the eggs.

We have also been working hard on our defeating the monster stories this week and have started to use our model text to innovate our own stories.

### Year 4



Year 4 have enjoyed our new maths topic of coordinates, starting with battleships! In English, the children have immersed themselves in our portal text, Elf Road, and are now ready to innovate the text with our own ideas. They also did really well during our rounders PE lesson and we will continue to learn new rules and develop our batting and fielding skills over the next few weeks.
