This week in...

Rainbow Woods Preschool



This week the weather has been nice and warm. We discussed how to keep ourselves cool and comfortable in this summer weather. We should wear light coloured clothes, wear hats when outside, apply sunscreen and keep ourselves hydrated all the time. We have been doing sand play and have recreated the sea. We have placed different sea animals in the tuff tray like sea horses, sharks and wales. We finished our animal kingdom display board using different techniques and materials - it looks amazing. We spoke about how to take responsibility for the things that you do.

Reception



This week in Reception we have innovated the story of The Sheep and the Goat and have come up with our own animal to add into the story. In maths we have looked at two numbers that make 10. In RE we have talked about the parable of the Talents. We had a visit from a goat this week and got to ask lots of questions. We have been using cutting, sticking and joining techniques to make our own animal enclosures. In Forest School we have been on a bug hunt.

Year 1



In year 1 this week we have been continuing our instructions unit by watching Mrs Malcolm make a medieval style honey cake. We took photos of each step and this demonstration, along with the photos have helped us plan and write our innovated instruction text. At the end of this half term the children will follow their innovated instructions to make their own medieval style honey cakes for our royal banquet. We have also learnt about the artist – Henri Matisse, and the different castles in the UK and the south west.

Year 2



Year 2: This week in Music we have been exploring pentatonic scales (5notes in a sequence) and then using our xylophones to play a sequence. We have also been learning a song about a '5 note scale' and singing it in 2 parts (class is divided into two groups. In Forest school we have collected items from the garden and played Kim's game!

Year 3



In Year 3 this week we have worked hard on writing our own defeating the monster stories. All the stories contain exciting language and have been written up neatly to create a display in our classroom. We also compared our questionnaire results from last week's history homework to find out how technology has changed over time, we found that technology was really different when our grandparents were younger compared to what we have today!

Year 4



Year 4 have started their invent writes this week, creating portal stories - they have got some wonderful ideas. We have so spent time reminding ourselves about the importance of internet safety, including the importance of being kind and appropriate towards others, even when using online sources. An important message to discuss and reiterate at home as well. We finished the week, creating timetables for Kilve - the children were very excited to find out their groups and which activities they would be doing.

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about

ROBLOX

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? Roblox is one of the most popular video games on the market. By,2020, the game's makers were claiming that more than half of children in the USA play it. As a 'sandbox' title, Roblox offers a huge amount of creative freedom; it lets players create their own gaming experiences with the Roblox Studio to build custom levels and games, which can then be shared with other players online. Roblox fosters creative thinking and enjoys a robust online community of fans.

CONTACT WITH STRANGERS

Robiox encourages players to communicate online (including a group chat facility). This could expose children to risks such as scammers, online predators, harassment, griefers and more. The in-game chat has some filters, but isn't perfect: players can still send harmful messages to others – such as scam links or general hostility – while predators can reach out to children directly.

PUBLIC SERVERS

Robiox has private or VIP servers which allow people to play exclusively with their friends, but this costs money. Most Robiox players will instead be on public servers that anyone can join. Servers can host games which focus on all kinds of aspects, including direct player interaction. Some games and servers, therefore, will put children more at risk of contact from strangers than others.

ONLINE DATERS

These are also called 'Obers' and are quite common in Robiox. An ODer is an individual who joins a game with the intention of finding someone to dote online — and eventually meet in person. Suconline dating is against the Robiox community guidelines, but this usually doesn't deter ODers. Some player-built Robiox game worlds have even been designed with online dating specifically in mind.

OEGI RATING

IN-APP PURCHASES

Robiox is actually free to download and play, but bear in mind that there are some hidden costs. Players are encouraged to make purchases in the game, for example, using real money, People can also buy extra Robux (the in-game currency) to spend on cosmetic items in the game, while it's possible to purchase a private or VIP server.

Advice for Parents & Carers

OSCAR!

SET PARENTAL CONTROLS

Roblox comes with several parental control options, which are explained well on the game's official website. It's essential to enter the correct date of birth for your child, as that allows Roblox to automatically apply the appropriate chat filters. The game also allows parents and carers to set monthly spending restrictions and monitor their child's account.

DISABLE PRIVATE MESSAGING

Roblox's private messaging function raises the risk of children being contacted by people they may not want to speak with – potentially leading to bullying, harassment, toxicity and scam attempts. The game allows you to disable messages from anyone who hasn't been added as a friend on your child's account.

PRIVATE SERVERS

If your child has some genuine friends to play Robiox online with, paying for a private or VIP server decreases the risk of contact from strangers. Even then, however, some players could invite other people – who might not necessarily be child friendly – into the private server. If your child is a Robiox fan, it's important to talk with them regularly about who they are playing the game with.

MONITOR SPENDING

If they don't understand they're using real money, it's easy for children to accidentally spend a sizeable amount in the game. Using parental controls to place limits on their spending will help avoid any nasty financial surprises. Ensuring that you have two-factor authentication on your payment accounts also makes it harder for your child to spend money inadvertently.

DEALING WITH STRANGERS

At some point in their development, your child will need to learn how to deal with strangers online. Show them how to block and report any users who are upsetting them or asking uncomfortable questions. Talking to them about what's OK to discuss—and what they should never tell a stranger online—will help them understand how to communicate with other people online safely.
