


Christian Values

This week we are encouraging the children to get prepared for school by practicing turn taking, sharing, being kind and table manners etc.

We played a little game of getting ready quickly by putting socks and shoes on.

We have a student doing his work placement with us and the children are enjoying interacting with him.

We are practicing the graduation song this week and we will be getting ready for our big day!!

Reception



In Reception this week we have continued with our story of Billy's bucket and have used our sounds to write a list of sea creatures. In maths we have been using two colours of snap cubes to compare towers of up to 10 cubes and the numbers hidden within 10. We shared our first curriculum showcase and took part in pirate themed crafts. In Forest school we fed the birds meal worms and looked after our vegetable patch.

Year 1



In year 1 this week we have enjoyed learning to play rounders in our PE lesson. The children did so well and joined in enthusiastically, despite it being quite a difficult team game to comprehend with the complex rules. We had several rounders scored and some excellent fielding skills on display! In literacy the children have finished writing their innovated stories "Brownilocks and the three snakes". They included some excellent adjectives to describe the setting and all remembered to include repeated speech to make it a cumulative tale.

Year 2



We began the week by finding out more information about lighthouses and then as a class worked out how we were going to construct our lighthouses. In English we wrote our instructions making sure that we did not miss out any steps.

Finally, we made our lighthouse models and they look fantastic. It has been so exciting having our parents visit to day and help us construct model wooden boats!

Year 3



Year 3 have had a busy week! On Monday afternoon we had PE coaches from Kings visit us to do a PE lesson, we did lots of throwing and catching skills. On Tuesday, we spent the afternoon being scientists and learning about how the muscles work in our body. Finally, after a busy transition morning on Wednesday, we had lots of our parents join us for our curriculum showcase afternoon, where we made some fantastic wind turbines linking to our Geography topic on how we energise our homes!

Year 4



In Year 4 this week, we have been completing our final Invent write - explaining what tsunamis are. The children have really enjoyed this unit of writing and produced some really interesting work. We loved playing rounders on Wednesday and the progress they have made is amazing! Finally, we have been busy preparing for the Leaver's service next week, which will no doubt be an emotional and personal celebration of these wonderful children.
