We also shared our school values – Respect, Kindness and Compassion, Forgiveness, Thankfulness & Responsibility.



We would really like parent & pupil feedback and input on this too. What do you

feel is Weare Academy First School's identity? Once the initial designs are back in the new academic year, I will share this with the school community for feedback before committing to a final design. Please be reassured that there will be a long period of transition, there will be no expectation that children wear brand new logo'ed uniform overnight. Other schools have started this process and have said that the transition period can be as long as two years. Rainbow Woods Preschool



This start of the week has been a tearful one as we have been preparing for our graduation which was so amazing even our tadpoles did amazingly well and enjoyed watching their friends sing. We're so proud of them all! Also, this week we have been practicing our numbers, talking about kindness, sharing and roleplaying activities around our Christian Value-Responsibility. Our children have come up with some lovely things they like to do to take responsibility like looking after their pets or tiding their room. To finish our week, we will be talking about how we can keep ourselves active in the holidays. Next term will be 'All about me' so the children will be drawing a self-portrait ready to put up in school-so exciting.

Reception



In Reception this week we have been talking transition and the changes to expect when the children move onto year 1. Children have been continuing to write captions and speech bubbles using their sounds. In maths we have talked about subtraction and how this can be recorded using a number sentence. In Forest school we have looked after our class vegetable patch and were excited to see how the sunflowers, tomato plants and carrots are growing.

Year 1



What a fun and exciting penultimate week we have had in year 1, the highlight being our large scale, class water fight with an ice lolly treat at the end - and what perfect weather we had too! The children have also finished their invent writes where some children did a Euro's themed story 'Gareth and the three lions' (based on Goldilocks and the three bears - our unit focus this half term!).

Year 2



This week we have started our final D.T. Project for the year designing and sewing coasters. The children are doing so well at this challenging activity but there are some excellent creations emerging.

In addition, in Maths we have been revisiting the use of money and recognition of the value of coins. We have been finding out how to use the least number of coins to show a total and working with amounts over £1. It would be great if children could be given the opportunity at home to use actual coins to purchase items during the Summer holidays as a way of becoming more familiar with actual money.

Year 3



It has been another busy week in Year 3! On Wednesday we visited Kings Leisure Centre and spent the day completing lots of different sports activities such as dance, hockey, dodgeball and obstacle courses, all children really enjoyed the day! We have now ended the week with our math's unit on 'time' finished, newspaper reports written in English and our Geography and Science topics completed. We are excited for a fun last two days of Year 3!

Year 4



Year 4 had a brilliant day at Kings of Wessex on Wednesday, where they were treated to a day of outdoor activities, from football skills to a water relay - it was excellent! However, the highlight of this week was our incredibly special Leaver's Service at the church, were we had the opportunity to reflect on the wonderful journey our year 4 children have been on during their time at Weare.
